KOICA (Korea International Cooperation Agency)



KOICA (Korea International Cooperation Agency) was established in April 1991 to manage the government's bilateral grant aid programs. Its mission is to foster international development cooperation by promoting friendly relationship and mutual exchanges with the developing countries and supporting their economic development.

To this end, KOICA has launched a wide range of programs from development projects to invitation of trainees, overseas volunteer program, humanitarian assistance and disaster relief, civil society cooperation, assistance through international organizations, and research and education on international development cooperation.

What is ODA Education Center?



The ODA Education Center was established as the first professional education institution in Korea to raise public awareness and understanding of international development cooperation and to train specialists working in the field. It provides a variety of **education programs for global citizenship** and international development cooperation.

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What is Global Village?



The Global Village offers opportunities to experience the culture of our partners (developing countries) that receive economic and social support through our government's grant aid programs. It also delivers **global citizenship education** in conjunction with exhibitions.

What is Global Citizenship Education?

Global Citizenship Education aims to promote a sense of belonging to a common humanity with an emphasis on living together as a "we" not an "I", while providing knowledge of global issues such as human rights, poverty, interdependency, peace and environment, based on the understanding of international development cooperation and development education. As part of the Sustainable Development Goals set out by the UN, it also empowers the learners to take interest and active roles to resolve global challenges that transcend ethnic, cultural and religious differences.

What are the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)?

The SDGs are a set of goals pledged and announced by the international community as a successor to the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) in September 2015 at a UN Summit. The SDGs contain 17 goals and 169 targets that are to be fully implemented by 2030. These are not just to address the issues that the developing countries face; they are universal, transformational and future-oriented **goals for all of us** that require action from the entire world.

By 2030, ensure that all learners acquire the knowledge and skills needed to promote sustainable development, including, among others, through education for sustainable development and sustainable lifestyles, human rights, gender equality, promotion of a culture of peace and non-violence, **global citizenship** and appreciation of cultural diversity and of culture's contribution to sustainable development.
